April 8<sup>th</sup> Left Copenhagen over Korsoer Kiel Hamburg the next morning stayed there the whole day. We were at the museum only a "salon" as all the staying pictures were covered. Saw a drawing said to be of Thorvaldsen after Carstens Apollo the muses & Graces we have a small copy also a portrait of Carstens coloured of which we have a photograph.- Left Hamburg by night train, arrived in Frankfurt next Morning and had a stay of a few hours which we used to see the Städtliches museum which disappointed Carl a good deal. Left at 1 o'clock for Luzern where we came at half past ten at night and were thankful to go

to bed

Friday. first a nice walk around the town & saw Rigi & Pilatus considering the weather which was en... & heavy clouds overhanging. At about .. o'clock we had seen a good deal and of course the Lion of Thorvaldsen which is very imposing.

In the afternoon we boated down the lake though the weather was anything but tempting, snow & sleeth & wind so I had to seek alone to the saloon very often. We stopped at Brunnen & sailed back again almost immediately to Luzern, where we stayed the night.

Giovanni Evangelista og saa Rafael malerierne hvor det mitterste parti med Madonna som bliver kronet af Jesus er nedtaget og har faaet en god plads i det store bibliotheque Værelse. The apostles were very good & their feel were well done better than any later seen - The other Batistery had the font still used for baptism The patterns decoration were lovely the whole place looked so I m apeice but sadly wanting looking after so the damp does severe damage

Appolonari in Classe a beautiful drive out of town where we passed a quantity of fields some with rice! Lovely Church inside with 12 pillars on each side with bases & capitals are so lovely like the honeycomb. Above the pillars the whole length are small round pictures in dark blue ground with portraits in mosaic of saints. The choir has a fine altar in grey marble supported by four fine pillars & a baldaquin - The bases of the four are of yellow marble. Round the choir seats in a formed circle, the choir windows are lovely inlaid in mosaic all different patterns & very well preserved. There were ten different

sarcophages from different years, some very well chiseled others in decline. The choir had a lovely bit of mosaic blue ground with stars & a cross with a small portrait of Jesus in the centre very lovely. Round about & filling nearly the whole round were lambs grazing and trees round about.- Between the lambs were lilies, stiff but looked nice - A broad mosaic with the Emperors Constantine Tiberius was very good also Melchisedec at a decked table. The three lambs above are meant to be the three apostle who saw the transfiguration (Forklarelse på bjerget, red.) which is placed above but looks queer as if Elias was swimming a land

is emblematic of Christ. All the mosaics above the choir are almost spoiled by damp - A lovely Altar on four Pillars is very pretty. We drove Ms Ball & I out to the Pine forest here Garibaldi lost his wife Anita & there have been several battles fought in this forest - We ... Carl on the way back at Classe where he preferred staying. On the way we saw large plantations of Rice under water - men

Thursday. St Vitale lovely oh so lovely. The capitals of the pillars were so beautifully carved. The choir was lower at the the back & in front a little higher the roof was divided into four mosaics. In the centre the lamb with a gloria over its head and four figures standing on balls - Round the entrance were medals with portraits of the apostles very well... all the frames different some in gold some white & black - here were in the window frames & every where, that a small border could be used - new patterns most lovely

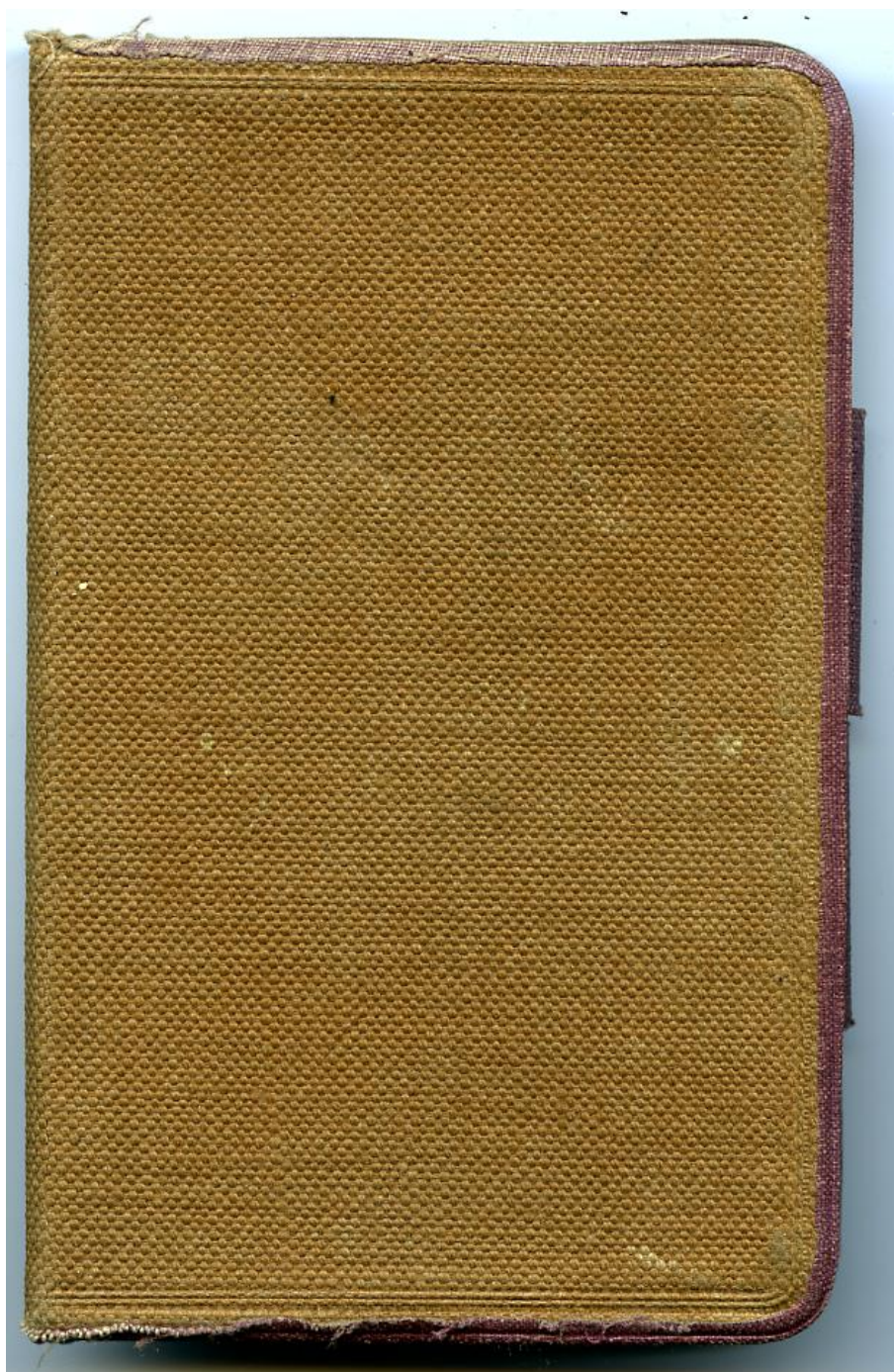

In four small places three angled sort of places were baskets with fruit & doves ppecking them so sweetly done.

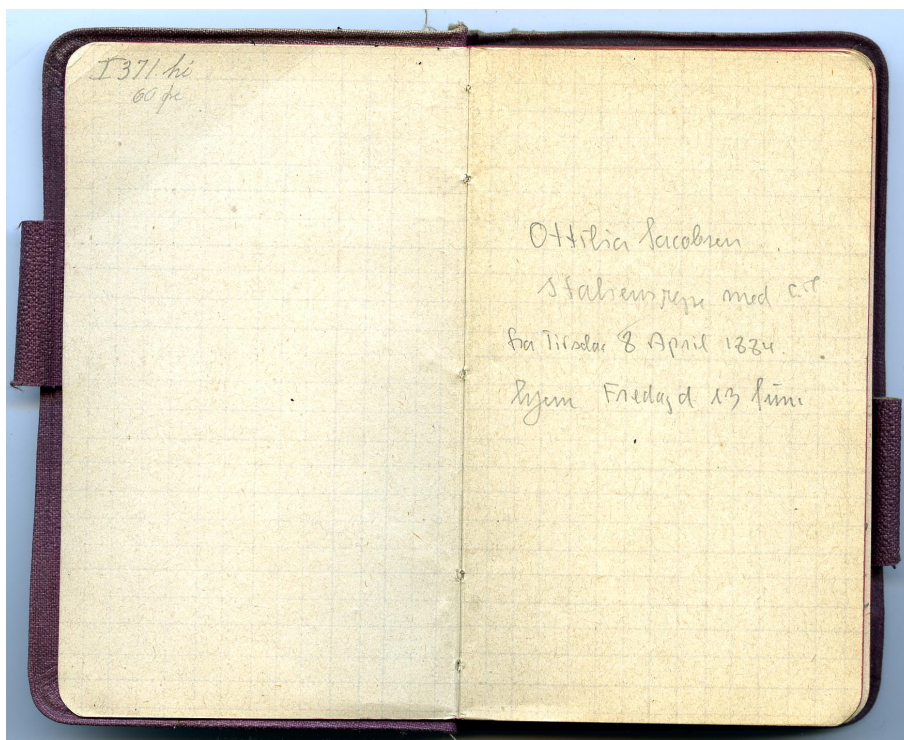

We went upstairs and the floor looked so well from there. We then went to Galla Placidia

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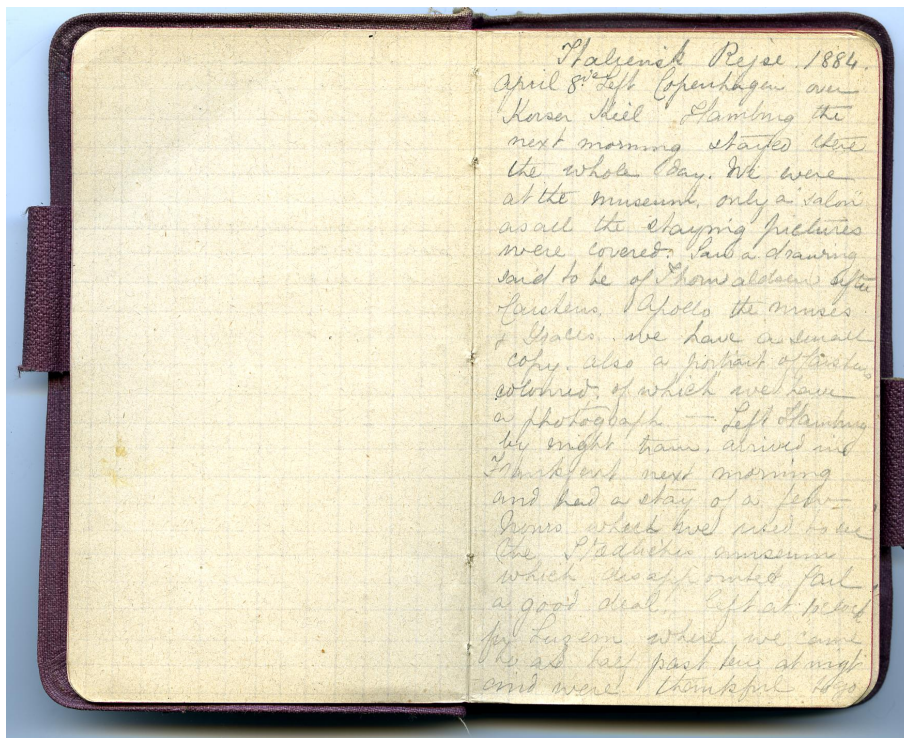

ation - Gallia Phaedra  
her tomb had been covered  
with silver - which was  
stolen under Gustav 2. 1697  
The building was in  
the Latin cross form.  
The four vaults were  
beautifully decorated in  
the north & and the high roof  
in deep blue ground was  
very splendid. A cross  
was the centre piece &

there were two vases  
with small doves drinking  
that were lovely. The  
leaved ornaments gold in  
dark blue, but one in  
middle of Basilica's  
fall means that they are  
Roman origin -  
Over the entrance was  
an exquisite mosaic of  
Christ as the good shepherd  
& most graceful figure.  
The sheep were not as  
good, on the whole these  
beasts were not good.  
Lions perfectly dreadful  
after winged - there was  
the swastika used but  
fall means no ornament  
not as having any meaning.  
The four Evangelists  
were only represented by  
their symbols in the four

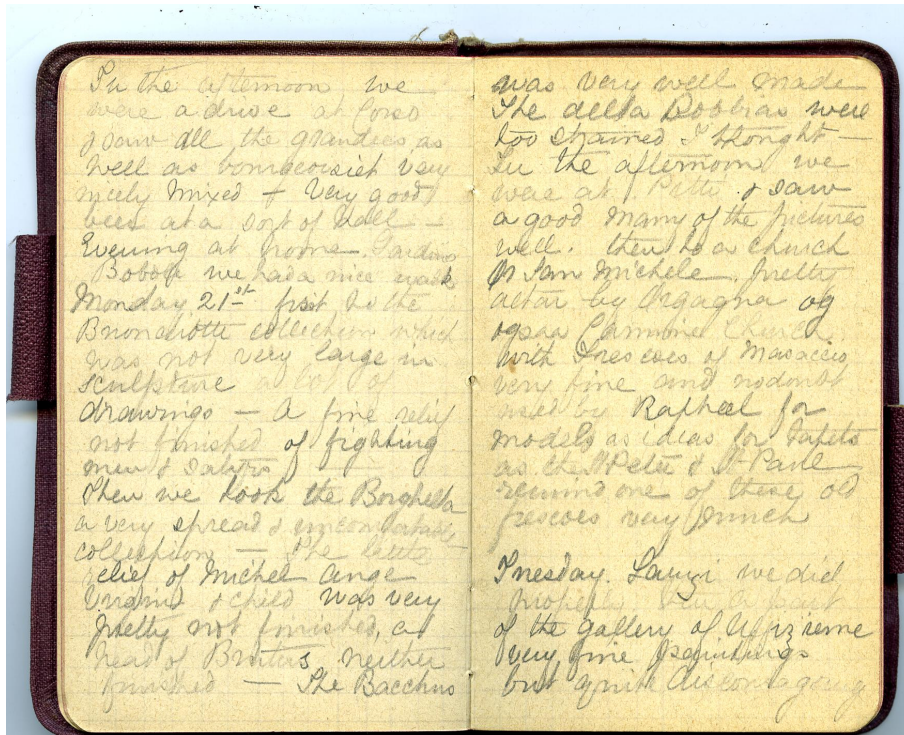
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After breakfast we took  
a little train to Appolonia  
in Ancona - before returning  
to Bologna by four train.  
There we arrived at about  
noon, had dinner &  
then went to bed for  
four hours. When we had  
to start for Florence where  
we arrived at 7 next  
morning.  
Saturday I got a very decent  
room at Pension Riccioli  
very central & we thought  
it every way preferable  
to Hotel de la Ville. I did not  
go out till after lunch which  
was at one o'clock when  
we drove to see the church  
St. Maria - which lies up  
a hill & was beautiful. I  
saw a mosaic in the  
altar & the choir - the  
frescoes were not much  
of to enjoy - Then we  
saw the David of Michel  
Angelo - from here we  
took a lovely drive, coming  
to A-Scce the Florence  
Memorial A.D. 1492 where  
the tomb of Michel Angelo  
David, Galileo Michelangelo  
Pensio stands side by side  
It is not a seeing the  
Giotto's frescoes till another  
day in good light - We  
kept strolling home through  
the streets on here for dinner  
Sunday we heard Mass  
in the dome afterwards  
to the splendid gallery  
Then drove out to Fiesole which  
showed us life and character  
& homeliness very comfortable

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In the afternoon we were a drive at Corso  
I saw all the grandees as  
well as bombasich very  
nicely mixed & very good  
beet at a sort of Hotel -  
Evening at home - Gardens  
Bobby we had a nice walk  
Monday 21<sup>st</sup> first in the  
Bernabotte collection which  
was not very large in

 Borghese & dined at Ponte

 and certainly good  
 weather — first day

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Monday - Vatican Museum  
with sculptures - Peter's  
Church of little St. Paolo  
Gloria le Ignori - dressed  
to near Pantheon dined  
very cheaply near & walked  
home in the evening  
Spore St. Angelo in the morning  
Tuesday  
Straight to St. Giovanni  
in Lateran & the museum  
very nice church but not  
like St. Paolo nearly two  
private family chapels  
belonging to the Perkins  
& Polonia were very  
splendidly mounted  
with engraved Malachite  
etc. - I drove in train  
home at 5. We had  
such a nice lunch  
inside the church a huge

with the transparency

in the shading has.

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very fine coloring & the expression of the faces is so fine & so different - Murray's critique is excellent I thought on that same picture - We then went to the Sistine chapel & saw Michelangelo's roof & large doornings, the pictures of God in the roof are grand, the creation & however grand in style & drawing, wants for me beauty in a great degree - it is heavy I know but I can't see otherwise as yet.

Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> of May.

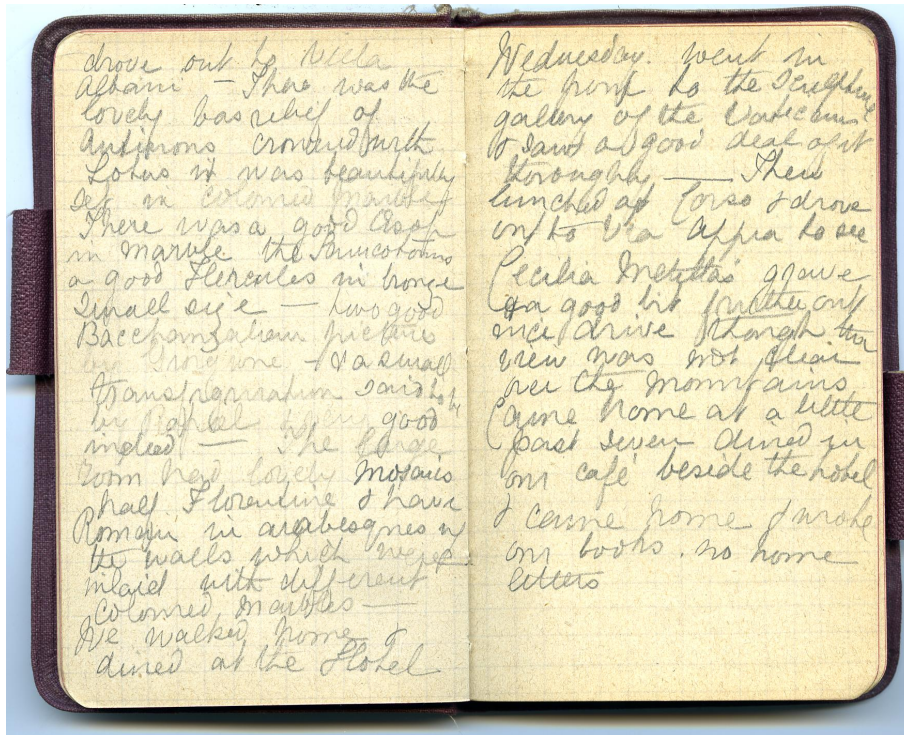
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Sunday we were first

lunched in the Corso & then

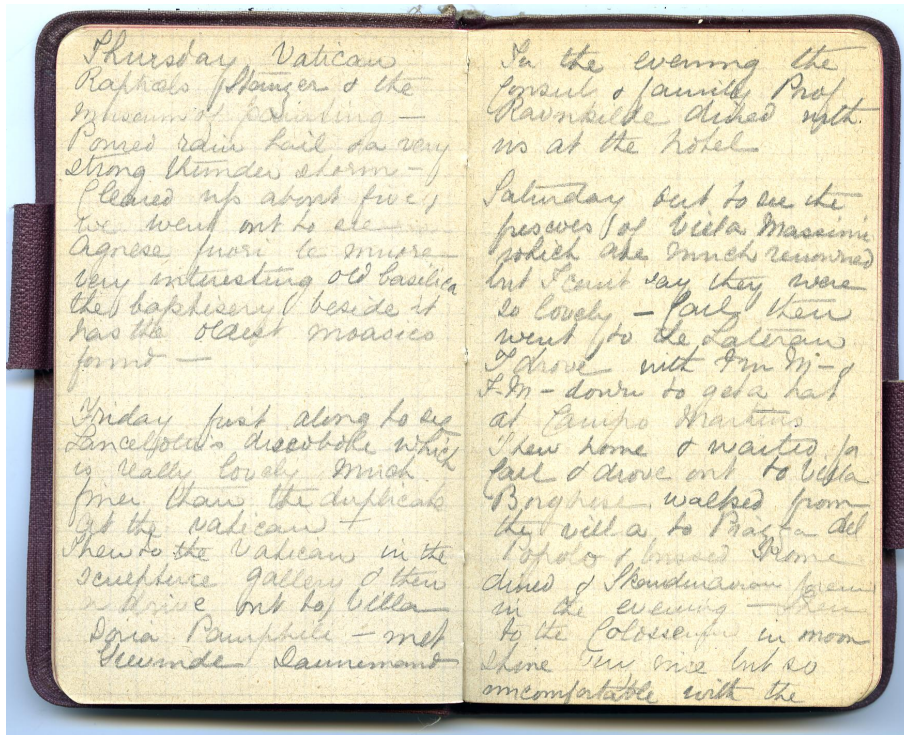
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drove out to Villa

preserves of Villa Massimo  
which are much renowned  
but I can't say they were  
so lovely - partly then  
went to the Lateran

I saw some & waited for  
fall & drove out to Villa  
Borghese - walked from  
the villa to Piazza del  
Popolo & passed some

uncomfortable with the

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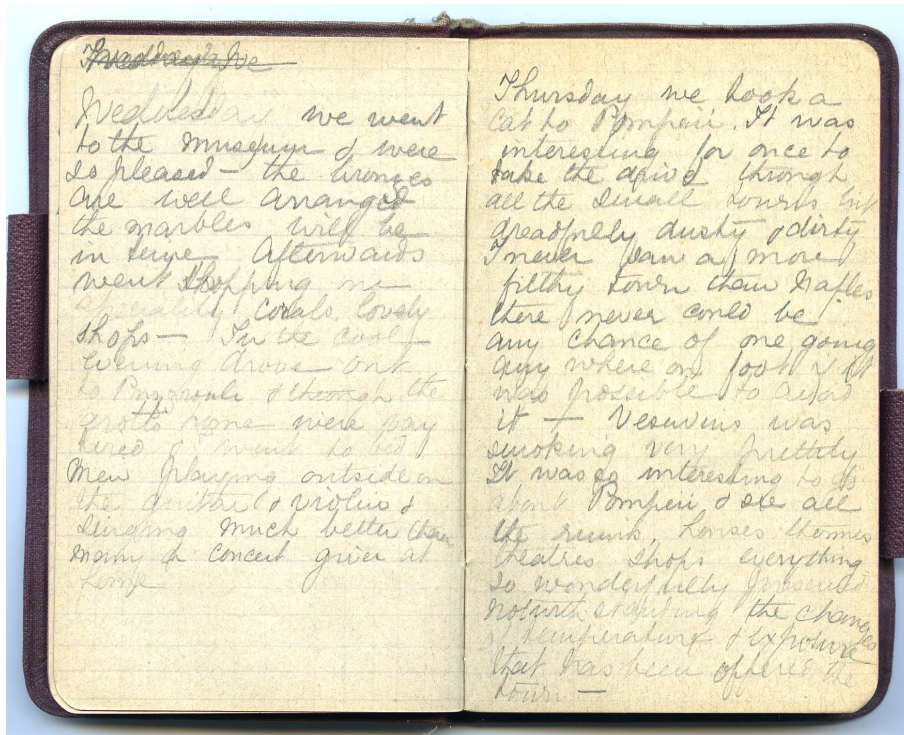
feeling of loneliness

visited him.

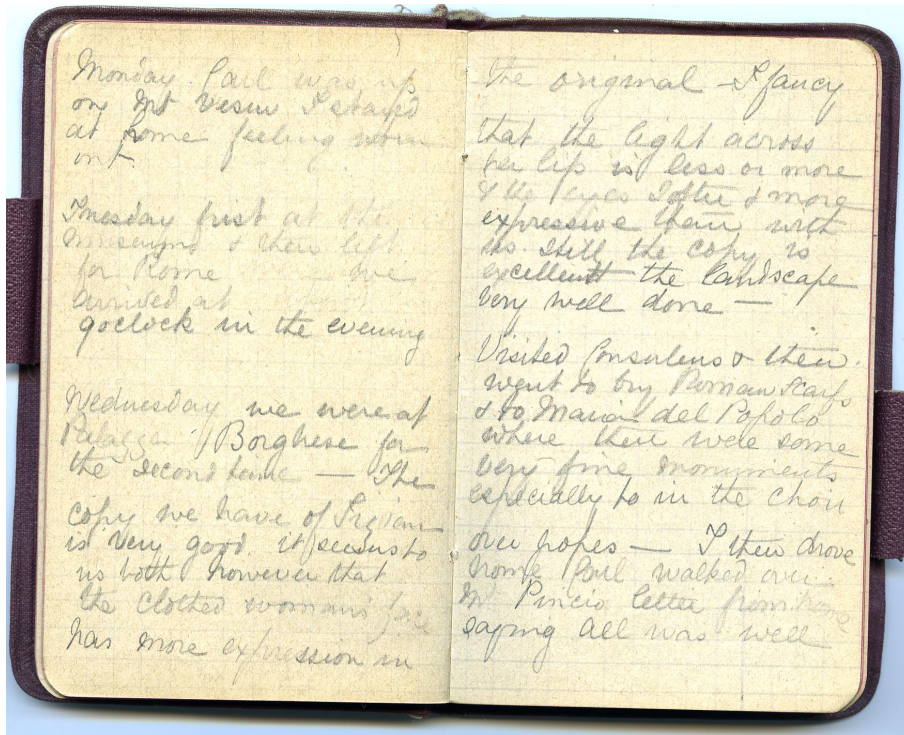

saying all was well.

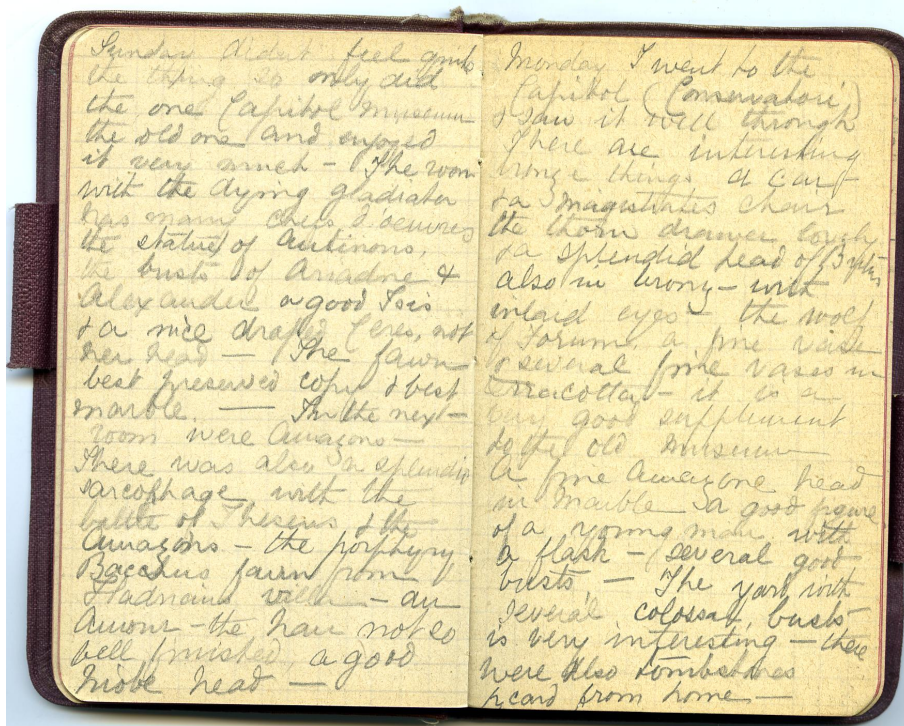
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Thursday - Latuan church

a splendid head of Psyche  
also in ivory - with  
enlaid eyes - the wood  
of Torum, a fine vase  
of several fine vases in  
terracotta - it is a  
very good supplement  
to the old Museum -  
A fine Amazone head  
in marble - a good piece  
of a woman's marble with  
a flask - several good  
busts - The yard with

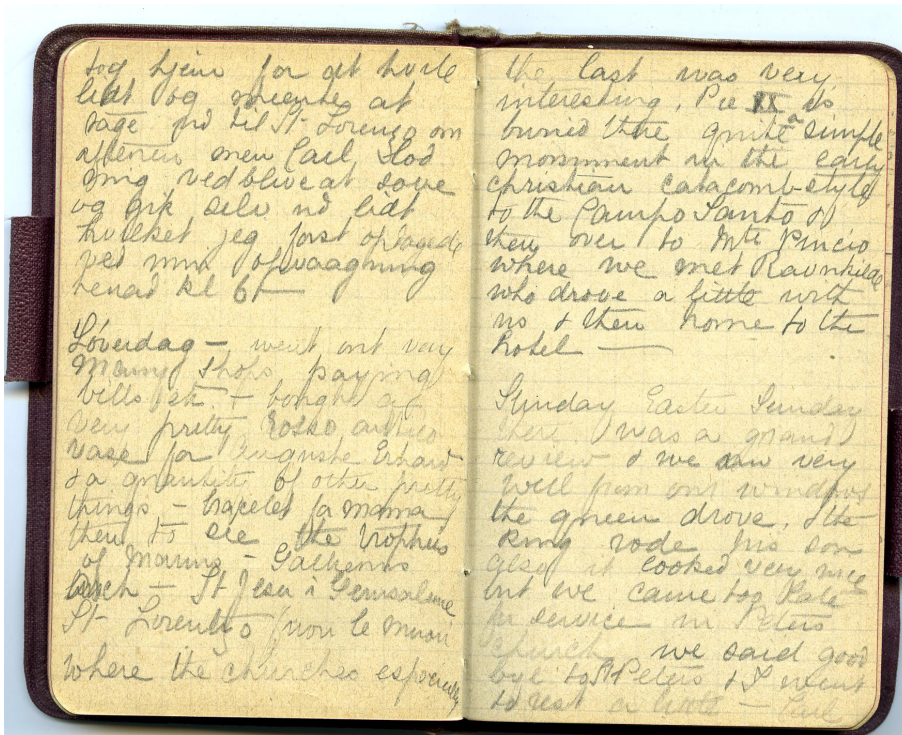

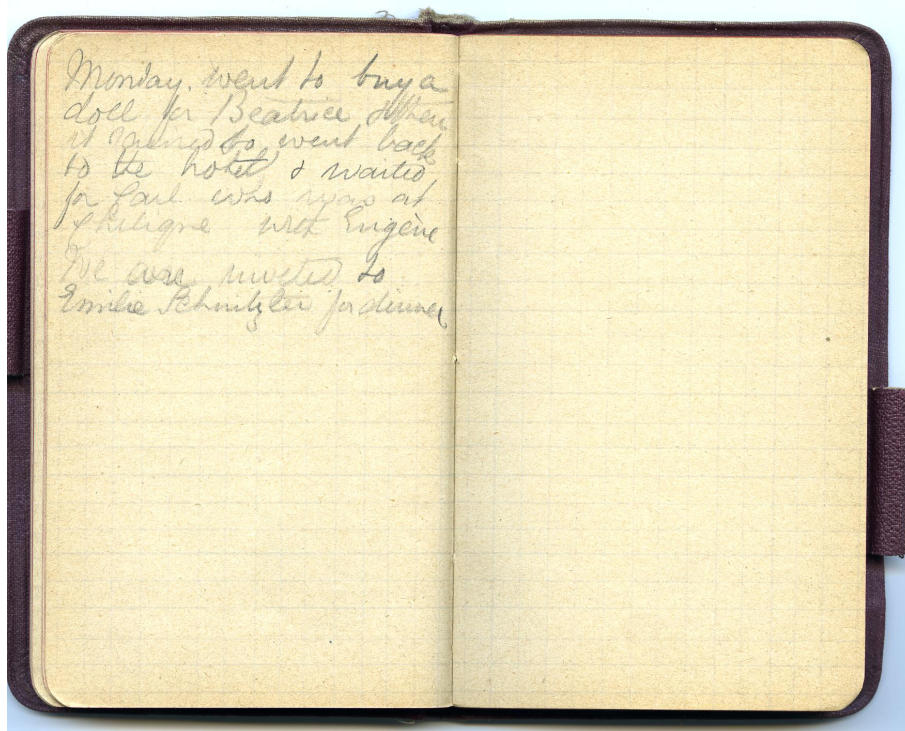
